## 8. NFPA Changes and Updates - Mike, Todd, Roseanne

- Mike Mathews provided an update on upcoming changes to standards thanked
   Roseanne and Todd for feeding into the gear and trucks
- A lot of information and feedback from manufactures and looks like it will be pushed back
- High-level a lot of the standards related by gear and put into one standard
- Same for trucks into one standard
- SCBA changes will be minimal and amalgamated with all other standards are delaying the standards looking into 2025
- NFPA updates will be kept up to date as it comes in

## 9. PFAS - Options for Materials - Dan

- What is available for PFAS free materials out there right now?
- Michelle O'Hara spoke to the outer shell to moisture barriers steadfast clear is going to be launched next month
- A non-coordinated moisture barrier being produced next month and a few are going this way
- · Gore material announcement coming
- Limited products currently
- Jeremy Inglis updated that the cost of buying these options and get this out to the members and educate and update the members regards to PFAS and PFAS free options.
- Jeremy will ask for Dan, Mike and Roseanne to work further on this
- Trevor concerns over newly purchased PFAS gear versus the non pfas gear.
   Keeping up with the rush. Bunker gear will become cost prohibitive. Once multiple options the flood gates will be opened.
- Jeremy spoke to it will be an education and conversations this will be a multi-year fix
  as the resources are not there for immediate switch over.
- Don Kruger spoke to some fire departments can only afford to get three sets bunker gear a year. Around \$3,000 a set of bunker gear right now.



- Mike Mathews spoke to unions and chiefs on how to work on this together and educate importance of making this transition
- Will the gear be a 2 year or longer versus PFAS
- Rob Anselmi spoke to the wear and tear, cylinder life and starting well before our contract is over lifespan
- Trevor spoke to large and medium size departments how hard and how realistic training scenarios are
- Jeremy Inglis wants to do work with Section 21 and OAFC Health and Safety
   Committee (lead committee) on what we collect we will send it out of this committee for their input
- Jeremy spoke to Dr. R. Bryan Ormond to speak to this at the conference. (Keynote Transitioning the Fire Service to PFAS-Free Alternatives: Trade-Offs in Exposure
  and Performance)
- Steve asked is there an option for a retrofit of a new liner for the moisture barriers to the gear been presented or on the table if we have heard of yet
- Trevor Picard indicated would look into that retrofit and get back to the committee
- Michelle said to keep an eye out for how BC moves on it. Snowball effect on how the provinces are changing it—does it mean provincial funding. To see the legislative, funding side
- Jeremy is saying how the grant funding side and can shift look at cancer preventions
   side with inclusive evidence when it comes out
