1. Greetings

OAFC 2nd VP Rick Arnel chaired the meeting at the request of Zone Rep. John Kobarda who was unexpected absent due to emergency needs in his municipality.

The Chair called the meeting to order at approximately 1015 hrs. and introduced host Chief Rick Richardson who welcomed members to the community and their great agricultural hall facility

2. Guest Speaker

Doug Goodings, OFM Manager of Academic Standards & Evaluation provided a comprehensive update on the status of the gap analysis and the transition of the Ontario firefighter training curricula to the NFPA standards. Doug presented information on the following main points of interest:

The Grandfathering Policy to grant equivalency based on current education and experience is now in the hands of stakeholder groups with a deadline for comment of Oct. 15.

Immediately following this comment period all Fire Chiefs will receive details and instructions on the Grandfathering Policy via Communique

In most cases current certifications will be correspond with NFPA level II equivalencies, with the exception of the Fire Prevention Officer program which will receive level I equivalency

New NFPA pilot courses will begin as early as November & December with full implementation of NFPA course offerings beginning in 2014

Provincial Evaluators will be required to complete skills evaluations for Firefighter I & II elements, in a similar fashion to the T/F program in the Ontario curriculum. A series of 1 day workshops are running at the Fire College the week of Nov 18-22 to qualify Provincial Evaluators. In the first part of 2014 regional or district courses will be conducted to qualify local Provincial Evaluators. It was noted that an Evaluator for a specific skill is not permitted to be involved in the "hands-on" training of the candidates to be evaluated but local departments can share or interchange Evaluators

Grandfathering Window will be open till Dec.31 2015 for departments to apply for equivalency for existing staff

Effective Apr. 1 2014, an updated "Legislation" course similar to the previous CO/FPO 101 course will be mandatory for all firefighters and Pre-Service students in the province. This course will address specific Ontario content not included in NFPA standards

Drafting of the 2014 Course Calendar will begin the week of Oct. 15. At this point its difficult to estimate a release date or course registration dates due to internal reorganizations

It has recently been announced that The Ontario Fire College, as well as the Ontario Police College and the Correctional Services College, are now collectively part of the *Public Safety Training Division*, of the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services

Doug candidly responded to questions from members present regarding cancellation of many scheduled courses at the Fire College and the frequent short notice of the cancellations. The frustration is understood & the primary reasons for the cancellations are the realignment of the former courses with the NFPA standards. In some cases the content of scheduled courses is not included in the NFPA equivalent program so some of the courses have become redundant. The other contributing factor is that many departments have opted to wait for the transition to be completed and have been cancelling attendance at scheduled courses. Given the staffing challenges, the transition to NFPA, the reorganizations of the OFM and EMO, as well as the internal reorganization of the Public Safety Training Division & its affect on the Fire College, staff are attempting to be as responsive the Fire Service as possible

3. O.F.M. Update

- Fire Marshal has been meeting with Joint OFMEM Senior Exec Committee to identify and validate corporate priorities, business lines, org structure, etc.
- Sept. 11-12 OFMEM staff conducted first joint deployment in support of communities impacted by flooding in Northern Ontario
- Deployed "EMO" field staff will be utilizing "OFM" regional offices
- Shared training to begin ("EMO" staff will be attending "OFM" fall training sessions)
- Invitation has been extended to OFM staff to attend "EMO" regional meetings
- 3 new high-level positions being discussed: Deputy, Response Deputy, Field and Advisory Services Deputy, Prevention and Risk Mgmt

4. O.A.F.C. Board Update

 2^{nd} V.P. Rick Arnel provided the following update to members on current issues being addressed by the OAFC executive board:

• T.A.C. update

-A 1 day seminar has been added to the upcoming Mid-term meeting in Niagara Falls to provide training and clarification on the OFC requirements resulting from the Technical Advisory Committee recommendations regarding vulnerable occupancies and care facilities

-Also included in the 1 day seminar will be a workshop on the Integrated Risk Management tool. It is expected that the IRM will be distributed for use by the end of 2013

-The OAFC is recommending a similar Technical Advisory Committee approach to adequately address concerns regarding mid-rise construction methods

-Propane legislation is now moving to include RSMP process for installations under 5,000 gal water equiv. Ted Bryan & Frank Lamie are working on the process for the OAFC board

-The OAFC has been approached by the Sprinkler fitters association for support in implementing a certification process for their trade

- Elliot Lake Coroners Inquest

 inquest has just concluded
 Hicks/Morely was retained to represent the OAFC interests
- LODD Assistance program

 information will be provided at the Mid-term meeting regarding a launch of a program
 requested by the membership to assist affected by Line of Duty Deaths
 the program will be implemented by Zones
- Candidate Testing

-the board is working on releasing an RFP to establish a program that would consolidate all pre-employment testing for career departments

-OAFC will be seeking expressions of commitment from career departments that are interested in using the service

-interest has been expressed among some volunteer departments for a similar process and the board will attempt to model an appropriate process once the career process is established

-discussions have been ongoing regarding the feasibility and possibility of the public educators group joining the conference

-CO legislation to be effective in December & inserted retroactively into the code -new OFC to be released in July with over 300 new amendments

• OFM/MOL Outreach Strategy -OFM & MOL have partnered to deliver a "Perspectives of Compliance for the Fire Service" series of presentations to regional AMCTO meetings across the province -Zone 1 offering is at the AMCTO meeting at the London Convention Centre on Nov. 15
