- 6. Candidate testing service and hiring of new full time personnel program ready to start April 3rd.
- 7. Working with MNR a start in discussion to resolve open air burning in parks when burn bans have been issued by area Fire Departments.

ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION

Ted Bryan fire chief Otonabee-South Monaghan suggested that Guy Desjardins be invited to the AMES conference to explain how the new training changes will work.

Kelly Searson Fire Chief Hamilton Township explained how MTO and OPP meet regularly without fires presence to discuss changes on Provincial Highways. As fire departments are usually the first on scene and provide the bulk of the rescue and cleanup efforts, we need to be at the table for safety reasons.

Kelly suggested a resolution should be drafted and brought to the floor, to have the OAFC look into the addition of fire being part of any discussion.

Motion put forward by Mike Vilneff Fire Chief Cobourg seconded by Rick Caddick Fire chief Stirling Rawdon, to have Kelly draft a resolution and forward it to members. Carried

Rick Caddick stated that the Hasting Training Center has been appointed by the OPSC as a testing center for the area.

Mark MacDonald mentioned people are more worried about what is running on the rail lines through the Municipality. Rail safety is becoming a major issue.

Mark was discussing the problem Belleville is facing with large buildings that are not being supplied with standpipes during planning and construction. The department is forced to lay long stretches of hose line creating lost time and potention for large fire losses. Mark is looking to form a resolution that will address the OAFC Fire prevention Committee to look into changes to the building code to include standpipe systems on buildings where required. Mark put the motion forward with Scott Manlow seconding the motion. Mark with draft a resolution for the Zone 5 members.
