OAFC EXCECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Given by OAFC Executive Director Richard Boyes

- 1. Update on WSIB Coverage a) Volunteer issue cleared up for changes of duty of a firefighter. Proper wording needs to be used on the provided forms for a legitimate claim.
- 2. New elections process for board and zone members. Nominations must be in prior to the AMES conference and validated. Voting will start On the Saturday morning of the AMES conference at the registration area. Voting will continue up until Tuesday morning at 08:30 hours. For those not attending can cast a proxy vote. Check the OAFC website for all details.
- MTO Billing is going electronic. Those that bill the MTO for MVAs will need to sign up with the MTO as an authorized requester with a onetime fee of \$250.00.There is also a \$14.00 cost to get the licence plate info. Discussion are

underway to look at increasing the MTO fees we charge to cover the new electronic fee system.

- 4. OAFC has entered a partnership with the Solar Power Industry to develop training and information for the fire service. The solar safety handbook is coming out soon. Hopefully the week of April 13th 2015. Arranges will be made to try to supply booklets to each firehall.
- 5. Pan am Games, specialized funding has been secured for fire departments that are required for standby at certain areas of the games.
- 6. Ted Bryan and John Hays are part of a committee looking at whether changes or additions to the current IMS system are required from the Elliot Lake Inquest.
- 7. Next generation 911 becoming an issue with some 911 call centres. Texting is not set for use. Implementation costs are a factor for the change to the current system.
- 8. AMES conference ready to roll. Great speakers lined up. Trade event floor space sold out. Looking for a Sargent at Arms for the Memorial Service.
- 9. The board of directors are looking for members for the rural suburban committee.
- 10. Gravenhurst fire department had an incident with an injured firefighter. The OFM investigator wanted to seize firefighting equipment for the investigation. Thus taking a serious piece of equipment out of operation.
- 11. Occupational Stress Injury is the new handle for Mental Health issues.
- 12. The Senior Officer further education process is in swing for new or upgrading credentials.

ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION

Mark MacDonald-Belleville, Rail safety is becoming a large issue with residence of all Municipalities along the main lakeshore track system. Belleville also has plans coming forward for a large fuel transfer station for gas and diesel. A supply station for the 401 corridor.

Mike Vilneff- Cobourg, OAFC health and safety committee is starting to hold more meetings. Moving forward. Cobourg Fire has also stopped proving service for functions that had people jumping into ice water for liability reasons.

Chuck Pederson, Douro-Dummer, Chuck brought up an issue from FUS on a number of footnote changes to apparatus life span in comparison to the size of a Municipality. Could affect insurance policy ratings.

Lloyd Hutchinson, Brighton, is also hearing from residence about railway safety. An issue in a neighbourhood about heating a home with wood, smoke an issue with next home owner. Has anyone else have these kind of issues and what is a reasonable fix? Kelly Searson mentioned that VFIS has some new services, one mainly for mental health programs.

John Whelen, Quinte West and Robert Rutter, Prince Edward County are both using the VFIS driver training program.

Scott Manlow- new fire station in the works presently with a second to be constructed hopefully soon. Scott also mentioned that a sales person with a very aggressive sales pitch is trying to sell fire suppression systems for the windmills going up in the County.

Bob Branscombe cautioned members on any old fuel stations that may be in their Municipalities. They currently are having problems with a private property that needs to be cleaned up. May end up becoming the Municipalities liability to have it remediated. Rick Middleton, is working on the department's communications system. May need to update the whole radio system.

Mark Pankhurst- volunteer firefighters are now organized in the City of Kawartha Lakes.
