1. Review of Draft Minutes from April 18/19, 2013

Minutes accepted as read.

Action: Joe to finalize the minutes and distribute for posting on the websites.

2. Business arising from the minutes - none.

3. Review of the Fire Services Manual: Forward section - Joe

It is noted that the language in the "Forward" section differs slightly from that in more recently approved section 21 guidance notes.

Action: Joe to seek guidance on this content and report back to the committee. The committee consensus was to ensure future (and revised) notes try to specify which elements are legislated requirements and which are recommended best practices.

4. Review of GN Tracking/back-items - Joe

The committee was provided with an update on guidance notes in process. All previous back items were accounted for.

5. Review of HCN Draft GN - Andy

There was some discussion on improvements related to general hygiene and cross contamination, rehab areas and offgasing, as well as clarifying legislative references.

Action: Mike and Terry to revise for December.

Potential hazards presented by chemical suicides – Draft GN – update
 Updated note approved.

Action: Joe to send note to go out for comment.

7. Discussion: Guidance Note GN #4-9 Respiratory Protection – discussion of comments from MOL Provincial Hygienist

Some edits were made to this note to ensure fire services understand that a respiratory protection program is "fundamentally job 1" for any fire service employer, and that to be effective a program administrator must be appointed and trained as a best practice to ensure the program is effectively protecting fire fighters.

Action: Joe to revise and send note to go out for comment.

8. Review comments from the field on GN #3-1 and new Hoarding GN Comments reviewed. Joe to seek clarification on "direct vs general" capture. Committee decided to request the Hoarding issue as an information/alert through the safety associations rather than a GN.

Action: Joe to report back in December and connect with PSHSA.

9. GN #6-3 – Water and Ice Rescue – follow up from the Barrie FS presentation – John and Jeff

Reviewed and being updated to include the 4 types of water/ice rescue. Will be brought back to committee in Dec/13.

Action: John and Jeff to revise for December

10. GN #4-11 - Fall Protection from Elevating Devices - update - Joe

4-11 revised and to be taken back for review with MOL engineer and then Out for Comment. GN#6-29 was reviewed and it was suggested that it needs additional info on hand bars etc. Requested if Denys wants to try rewriting for Dec meeting.

Action: Joe to move 4-11 forward to comment, Denys to revise 6-29 for December agenda.

11. GN#4-2 - Eye Protection - update - Joe

Approved, this note to go for approval.

Action: Joe to move this note forward for approval.

12. Presentation on Trench Rescue Safety – John Teahan – Tunnel and Sewer Association

It was noted that GN #6-28 was meant to apply in circumstances where a trench had collapsed and rescue assistance was required. The association has some concerns around the potential jurisdictional overlap where the situation may be a medical aid from an otherwise "safe" trench. The committee recommended that the Association encourage their members to contact local Fire Services proactively to discuss emergency response to existing projects. Consensus was that GN#6-28 is ok.

Action: OFM to confirm "unsafe vs safe trench" is part of OFM Awareness Level Training, MOL to inquire into any recommendations with the Construction program.

13. Presentation on Radio Frequency (RF) Safety – Mike Amoyette - Toronto Corporate

A very informative presentation was given by Mike on the potential hazards related to radio frequency, discussiong panel, directional, and microwave antennas and related considerations for fire services.

Action: Andy to prepare a draft guidance note for review in December.
